

# There is / There are

## Examples:

### Affirmative:

There is a pen on the table. (Singular)

There are (three) pens on the table. (Plural)

There are (two) pens on the table. (Plural)

### Negative:

There aren't any pens on the table.

There aren't (two) pens on the table.

### Interrogative:

Is there a pen on the table?

Yes, there is. / No, there isn't.

Are there two pens on the table?

Yes, there are / No, there aren't
